The Paschal greeting and response in various languages

CHRIST IS RISEN! INDEED HE IS RISEN!

Arabic: Al-Maseeh qam! Háqqan qam!

German: Christus ist erstanden! Wahrlicít ist er erstanden!

Greek: Christós anésti! Alithós anésti!

Hungarian: Feltamadt Kristus! Valoban Feltamandt!

Polish: Khrístus zmartvíkstaw! Zaiste smartvíkstaw!

Slavonic: Christós voskrése! Vo-ístinu voskrése!

Ukrainian: Христос воскрес! Воістину воскрес!

The Sunday after Easter is the Sunday of St. Thomas, also known as Second Sunday or Antipascha ("opposite" Pascha, i.e., at the other end of Bright Week). Historically, this day in the early Church was the day that the newly-baptized Christians removed their robes and entered once again into the life of this world.

This day is also known as Antipascha. This does not mean "opposed to Pascha," but "in place of Pascha." Beginning with this first Sunday after Pascha, the Church dedicates every Sunday of the year to the Lord's Resurrection. Sunday is called "Resurrection" in Russian, and "the Lord's Day" in Greek. The Eastern Church dedicates every Sunday of the year to the Lord's Resurrection starting on this Sunday, the eighth day of the paschal celebration, the last day of Bright Week.

Celebration of the feast

Liturgically, the Church remembers the Apostle Thomas' vision of Christ after eight days. At that time he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side; do not be faithless, but believing." Thomas answered

him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe" (John 20:26-29).

As with all the services until the feast of Ascension the Easter Troparion is sung, and the epistle readings are taken from the Book of Acts, telling us of the first Christians who lived in communion with the Risen Lord. Finally, the gospel readings are from the Gospel of John, considered by many to be a gospel written particularly for the newly baptized.

Though the tomb had been sealed O Life, from the grave you arose, O Christ our God!

Though the door had been locked, You appeared among the disciples, O Resurrection of All!

Through them you renewed an upright spirit in us,
According to your great mercy!

Kontakion (Tone 8)

With his probing right hand, Thomas searched Your life-giving side, O Christ our God,

When You entered, although the doors were locked,
he cried out to you with the other apostles: You are my Lord and my God!
