Sunday After Theophany

Ephesians

7...to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift. 8Therefore He says: "When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, And gave gifts to men." 9(Now this, "He ascended"—what does it mean but that He also first a descended into the lower parts of the earth? 10He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) 11And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, 12for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, 13till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ;....

"THIS IS MY BELOVED SON, WITH WHOM I AM WELL PLEASED" (Matt 3:17)

"Each of us has received a special gift in proportion to what Christ has given...He did this to prepare all God's people for the work of Christian service, in order to build up the body of Christ" (Eph 4:7,12).

Matthew

12Now when Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, He departed to Galilee. 13And leaving Nazareth, He came and dwelt in Capernaum, which is by the sea, in the regions of Zebulun and Naphtali, 14that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: 15 "The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, 5 By the way of the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles: † 16The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, And upon those who sat in the region and shadow of death Light has dawned." 17From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

"Jesus ... departed into Galilee" (Matt 4:12) "Why does He depart? Again, He instructs us not to go to meet temptation but to give place and withdraw ourselves. He retires to Capharnaum; at once fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah (Is 9:1,2) ... by plotting against His forerunner and casting him into prison, they thrust Christ into Galilee of the Gentiles...Then He implies that they themselves did not seek and find, but that God showed Himself to them from above, He says to them, 'Light has dawned,' that is the light of itself sprang up and shone forth: it was not that they first ran to the light ... "

St. John Chrysostom on Matthew 4

"...Let us discourse a little about the Feast...and since the chief point of the Feast is the remembrance of God, let us call God to mind...that is, the Godhead...The Father is the Father...the Son is Son...The Holy Ghost is truly Spirit...(So) there ought to be worshippers on earth, that all things may be filled with...glory of God...Christ is illumined. Let us shine forth with Him Christ is baptized, let us descend with Him that we may also ascend with Him...What are we to learn and to be taught by all this? To purify ourselves first; to be lowly minded...Jesus is purified and do you despise purification?...Moses baptized but this was in water...John also baptized...not only in water but also 'unto repentance'. Still, it was not wholly spiritual, for he does not add 'and in the Spirit'. Jesus also baptized, but in the Spirit. This is the perfect baptism...I know also a fourth Baptism - that by martyrdom and blood, which also Christ Himself underwent; - and this one is far more august than all the others, inasmuch as it cannot be defiled by after-stains. Yes, and I know of a fifth also, which is that of tears, and is much more laborious." St Gregory of Nazianzus "Oration on the Holy Lights" Epiphany - 381 A.D.

Epiphany; divine life breaks forth into human life, in the person of a tiny Child. God is a God of surprises, wrapping the most special gifts in His unusual packages, as the late Cardinal Terence Cooke reminds us: "The gift of life, God's special gift, is no less beautiful when it is accompanied by illness or weakness, hunger or poverty, mental or physical handicaps, loneliness or old age. At these times, human life gains extra splendor as it requires our special care, concern and reverence. It is in and through the weakness of human vessels that the Lord continues to reveal the power of His love."
